

Robert Congleton Named New VP at Pacific Press®

Nampa, Idaho (August 13, 2015) — Pacific Press® board chairman, Elder Dan Jackson, announced after the board meeting earlier today that Robert Congleton has been chosen to replace outgoing vice president for production Larry Johnson.
