New Book by Adventist Religious Liberty Leaders Tackles Tough Issues

Nampa, Idaho (March 10, 2008) — Adventists have always walked a fine line between calling attention to important societal issues of the day—such as temperance or poverty—and avoiding any involvement in partisan politics. Following in that tradition, nine highly qualified experts have joined together to share their insights and provide clarity on some of today's most pertinent church and state issues.

Politics and Prophecy, a new book published by Pacific Press[®], tackles issues such as Religious Freedom in the Workplace and the Marriage Debate, and delves into the role of religious freedom in prophecy. Starting with an introduction on the foundations of freedom and the role of liberty in prophecy and moving to current issues, Politics and Prophecy is an in-depth biblical and historical look at religious freedom and what it means for us today. "It is a timely asset that will help Adventists and other

Christians know how to relate to many of today's public issues," says Dale Galusha, president of Pacific Press[®].
