Interesting Facts about October

- The name of the month of October comes from the Latin "octo", meaning "eight". The ancient Roman calendar was based on the lunar cycles, as opposed to our current calendar which is based on the solar cycles. This meant that there were originally 10 months in their calendar, and October was the eighth month. In 451 BC the two months of lanurarius and Februarius were added to the beginning of the calendar, making October the 10th month.
- The Anglo-Saxons name for October was Winterfylleth, with its name containing the words for winter and full moon respectively. It was named this because winter was said to begin from the first full moon of the month.
- October is a rather beautiful time of year if you live in the northern hemisphere. It's the time of year that the color of leaves begins to change into a magnificent array of hues.
- Another fun fact about October is that, according to folklore, if the deer have a gray coat in this month you should expect a hard winter.
- If you live in the northern hemisphere, you'll be rewarded for keeping your eyes to the skies in October, as the **Draconid Meteor Shower** can be seen. It contains a single comet that is visible exclusively in the northern hemisphere between the 6th and 10th of October.
- Some famous people born in October include Mahatma Gandhi, Angela Lansbury, Hillary Clinton, Bill Gates, Julie Andrews, Hugh Jackman, Alfred Nobel, Anne Rice, Arthur Miller, Auguste Lumière, Friedrich Nietzsche, Christopher Columbus, Johannes Vermeer, John Keets.
- The **traditional flower** of the month of October is the calendula, symbolizing comfort, healing, protection and grace.
- Some of the holidays in October include Canadian Thanksgiving, Columbus Day (the second Monday of October), United Nations Day (October 24), and Halloween (October 31).
