Many of us now file our federal tax return electronically. There are several brands of free tax-filing software available including: Cash App Taxes, FreeTaxUSA, TaxAct, TaxSlayer and TurboTax Free Edition.

In addition, the IRS and AARP, among other organizations, offer free tax-filing assistance to eligible taxpayers.

Don't forget to file your tax return, especially if you're on track to receive a federal tax refund. For the 2019 tax year an estimated 1.5 billion in federal tax refunds remained unclaimed as of June 2023!
