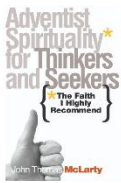
HR News . . .

Injury Reporting:

- To protect your rights, you need to report any job-related workplace accident, disease or illness to your supervisor as soon as possible
- There is no retaliation for reporting injuries
- Reporting your injury is not complete until your incident is electronically submitted in PressNet
- If medical treatment is needed, go to St. Alphonsus Medical Group Occupational Medicine; or when necessary, go to their emergency room
- Continue with your return appointments until you are released with no work restrictions or maximum medical improvement has been attained
- If you have questions or are unsure of what to do, speak to your supervisor or contact Mike Fifer, safety director.
