Special thanks to Pacific Press for holding another book drive for Treasure Valley kids this year! The 2019 Children's Book Drive was a monumental success!



During the week of April 10-14, businesses and organizations collected new and gently used children's books across the Treasure Valley. Those same businesses, as well as numerous passionate community members, dropped off the donated books at our temporary book processing center (a large warehouse courtesy of property management company The Sundance Company) at 8740 W. Fairview in Boise.

After tallying all of the donated books so far, we've already hit **75,000 total books**! This surpassed last year's total of about 71,000. Luckily, we had many volunteers to help begin cleaning those donated books.

At United Way, we are committed to breaking down barriers and working together across sectors to advance the common good. This was evident at the book processing center, with smiling volunteers from the American Red Cross, Wells Fargo, Payne West Insurance, Meridian Medical Arts Charter School Key Club, Saint Alphonsus Health System, UPS, PacificSource Health Plans, Boise State University, HealthWise, Meridian Lions Club, Book It Forward Idaho and more.

UPS drivers, in their iconic brown trucks, traversed the Treasure Valley, picking up donated books at each Albertsons location before dropping them off at the book processing center. Sharing '*time, talent and treasure*' to advance the common good—in this case, helping make sure local kids have books of their own to read—is a perfect example of **Living United**. This year's Pacific Press Summer Social will be on Thursday, June 27 at Hawks Memorial Stadium for a Boise Hawks game.




