ABC Managers Gather for Annual Marketing Seminar

Approximately twenty Adventist Book Center store managers from all over the North American Division gathered at Pacific Press Feb. 17–19 to preview new releases and to discuss book store business.

This annual gathering, known as "the marketing seminar," allows store managers to review recent releases and preview books that will be available for the camp meeting season, which begins in some territories as early as April. Marketing and sales staff present the details of each book, including distributed products from individuals and from Safeliz, Signs, and Stanborough publishing houses.

The new book presentations were split over two mornings; discussion items filled the afternoons. Managers shared concerns, asked questions, learned about new promotions, and traded marketing tips. During breaks, the guests sampled tasty treats Bonnie Laing baked from recipes in "The Earthy Canvas Vegan Cookbook." On Wednesday, Steve Ertel gave an overview of the brand new AdventistBookCenter.com retail site, which is set to roll out very soon.

Next week, Dave Gatton and Don Laing begin their "road show" visits. Each of these sales pros will host a series of mini marketing seminars at the larger ABC retail stores around the division for the local employees.

"The marketing seminar and the road shows give Adventist Book Center retail store employees a chance to get to know our broad line-up of products," says marketing director Alicia Adams. "That way, when customers come into their stores, approach them at camp meeting, or reach out online, they have the information they need to make thoughtful recommendations.
